- Minutes On a motion made by Mr. Nicole and seconded by Mr. Norman, the Administrative Committee approved the June 1, 2021 open session meeting minutes.
- Board Requested Legislation Ms. Gawthrop presented several legislative proposals recommended by staff for consideration by the Administrative Committee. Ms. Gawthrop recommended that the Administrative Committee recommend that the Board of Trustees present the following legislative proposals to the Joint Committee on Pensions (JCP), for the JCP's consideration to sponsor as legislation for the 2022 session:

<u>**Trustee Election Clarification.**</u> With respect to trustee positions who are members of a State system, staff recommends clarifying existing law to provide that only individuals currently employed as members may serve as a trustee representing the membership. Staff also recommends codifying existing practice to limit voting to active members and current retirees, and former members who are not actively employed or retired from voting in a trustee election.

Purchase of Service – Judges' Retirement System (JRS). State recommends repealing an obsolete statutory provision permitting the purchase of service credit for employment as a magistrate prior to July 1, 1977, and service as a Workers' Compensation Commissioner prior to July 1, 1977. Staff notes that SRA has not received an application from a member of the JRS who is eligible to purchase this service in at least 20 years. Staff also recommends explicating stating that members of the JRS are not eligible to purchase prior service credit accrued in other State systems.

Parole and Probation Reemployment. 2012 legislation exempted retirees of the Employees' systems from a statutory earnings limit if reemployed as a contractual parole or probation officers. In 2017, legislation required that any

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individual serving as a parole or probation officer on or after July 1, 2017 be a member of CORS but did not include a parallel earnings limit exemption within CORS for retirees of CORS who are reemployed as contractual parole or probation officers. Staff recommends that the Board of Trustees alert the JCP of this inconsistency, for its consideration regarding whether to extend the exemption to CORS retirees or eliminate it for retirees of the Employees' Systems.

Ms. Gawthrop informed the Committee that a second set of proposals would be presented in September that will focus on investment issues.

On a motion made by Mr. Norman and seconded by Mr. Nicole, the Administrative Committee approved the legislative proposals as presented, for recommendation to the Board of Trustees.

Member Services Update Mr. Reott provided a Member Services update, reporting that the most recent monthly numbers were slightly better than last fiscal year with a call abandonment rate of 16.43%. However, the average call wait time was 369 seconds, slightly above last fiscal year. Mr. Reott indicated that the report shows that in fiscal year 2021, the Member Services Unit received 136,146 total calls, an increase of 5% over last fiscal year. Mr. Reott commented that staff is looking into the reasons why SRA is experiencing an increase in call volume, to determine what can be done proactively, so members do not need to call for routine issues. Mr. Reott also reported that in fiscal year 2021, 24,000 pieces of correspondence was received and responded to, an increase of almost 50% from fiscal year 2020.

Mr. Haines asked how staff tracks the types of calls coming in.

Mr. Reott responded that when a call comes in, the retirement specialist answering the call will put a 2-digit code in the notes of the call, which allows staff to determine the reason for the call. Mr. Reott further responded that calls to check the status of a refund and inquiries concerning a retiree's direct deposit form make up majority of the calls.

Ms. Hill complimented and thanked Mr. Reott and his staff for going above and beyond when answer constituent questions, easing the fears of those who have questions about their retirements.
