Presentation regarding Fiduciary Liability Insurance The Administrative Committee received a proposal from representatives of Willis Towers Watson regarding fiduciary liability insurance. Mr. Tim Bowen, of Willis, presented an overview of the insurance proposal, which outlined the insurance companies offering the insurance, levels of coverage and annual premia for each.

Mr. Bowen commented that the policy would cover Agency staff with fiduciary responsibilities and plan assets. He also commented that for a fund with more than \$20 billion in plan assets, such as the Maryland State Retirement and Pension System, that he would suggest a policy of either \$5 or \$10 million to start and that the insurance policy be analyzed each year.

Mr. Kenderdine asked Mr. Bowen to remind the committee as to whom the insurance will cover, specifically the Trustees and certain Agency staff, and with respect to the Investment Committee, if it will cover the committee's Public Advisors.

Mr. Bowen responded that the carrier would follow State statute and include the System, and anyone identified in State statute as a fiduciary, including the Public Advisors.

Mr. Bowen also reported that the coverage is triggered when a claim is made and not as of when the triggering event occurred. If a claim is filed during the coverage period, the claim would be subject to coverage under a "claims made" policy even if the triggering event occurred before coverage began. If the System chose not to renew the policy, it would need to purchase "tail" coverage or coverage will lapse when the term ends.

Board Requested Legislation Ms. Gawthrop presented a document outlining the details of a legislative proposal concerning current provisions for a Fiduciary Bond for the System under § 21-210 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article. Ms Gawthrop requested, the Administrative Committee's consideration and recommendation to the Board of

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Trustees for inclusion in its 2021 legislative proposals to the Joint Committee on Pensions (JCP).

On a motion made by Mr. Haines and seconded by Ms. Benik, the Administrative Committee approved the legislative proposal as presented, for recommendation to the Board of Trustees.

Proposed Amendments to COMAR 22.02.01 – Option Factors and Annuity Values Mr. Reott presented proposed amendments to COMAR 22.02.01 – Option Factors and Annuity Values. Mr. Reott reported that based upon the actuarial assumptions adopted by the Board of Trustees for use in benefit calculations and the actual experience observed by the System's Actuary, Gabriel Roeder Smith & Co. (GRS), it is necessary to update the regulations to explain when the updated factors and values will apply to the Agency's calculations.

Mr. Reott asked Brad Armstrong from GRS to briefly address the Committee on the function of options and annuity factors used in determining benefits.

Mr. Armstrong stated that option and annuity factors are based on individual assumptions versus group assumptions in order to avoid gender discrimination. Therefore, a unisex mortality assumption is used for members and beneficiaries. The unisex mixes for various groups {TCS, ECS, Public Safety (SP, LEOPS, CORS), Judicial, and Legislator were chosen based on retiree elections over the past 5 years. To better protect MSRPS against adverse selection, the assumptions proposed are 6.15% interest and 2.6% inflation. The 6.15% is expected to be met or exceeded 75% of the time over a 20-year time horizon. COLA assumptions were based on rates used in the 2019 actuarial valuation and the mortality assumption was based on sample ages in 2023 (assumed midpoint of the effective period for the factors). The most recent mortality assumption adopted by the Board is based on a large-scale mortality study using exclusively public sector data for the first time. Therefore, GRS will be recommending further separation of groups. GRS will be proposing a separate set of factors for teachers, employees (excluding Legislator and CORS). Public Safety (SP, LEOPS, CORS), Judicial, and Legislator.

On a motion made by Mr. Haines and seconded by Mr. Nicole, the Administrative Committee voted to recommend that the Board of Trustees vote to submit the proposed amendments to COMAR 22.02.01 to the Administrative, Executive, and Legislative Review Committee, and publish them for comment in the Maryland Register, contingent upon the Board's approval of the option and annuity factors to be presented to the Board at its August meeting.

Member Services Update

Mr. Reott reported that the Member Services unit was unable to meet its goals for the call abandonment rate and average call wait time for the month of June 2020. The unit's call abandonment rate was 13.44% and the average "speed of answer" was 224 seconds for the month of June.

Mr. Reott further reported that it has been tougher on staff working remotely due to home set-up. In the office, each staff member in the call center has two monitors and a printer to be able to handle calls with optimal productivity. Mr. Reott reported that arrangements are being made so that beginning in

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September, half of the call center staff, may begin working on-site using an alternating schedule. Mr. Reott reported that there is sufficient number of offices, given the ongoing level of teleworking, to appropriately space employees out and ensure sufficient social distancing.

Mr. Norman commended Mr. Reott and his staff on working through the pandemic so effectively.

- (d) discussing the decision to recommend whether or not the Board of Trustees purchase Fiduciary Liability Insurance, pursuant to General Provisions Art., § 3-305(b)(14), to discuss, before a contract is awarded, a matter directly relating to a negotiating strategy or the contents of a bid or proposal, if public discussion or disclosure would adversely impact the ability of the public body to participate in the competitive bidding or proposal process.
